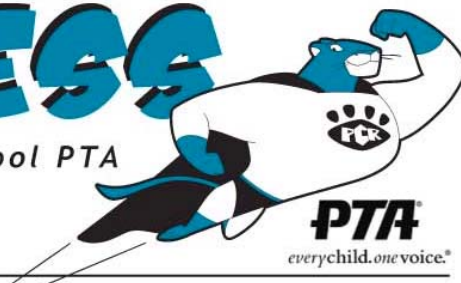

The Helen Grace Gourmet cookie dough and baked goods are always so helpful to have around as last minute playdate treats served warm from the oven, as though they were baked from scratch. There are plenty of other useful items such as kitchen gadgets and magazine subscriptions.

This is a significant fundraiser for Palm Crest. Past years, this fundraiser has provided the PTA the means to fund several programs such as the Art, Music and Science Docent Programs.

All students should have brought home their packets. Forget about turning in a bunch of paperwork with checkmarks in two separate packets. There is a new ***EZ Order Entry*** to submit your orders BOTH for Gift Wrap and for Gourmet frozen foods/ cookie dough together online!

1. Use the enclosed order form (in the packet sent home) to collect your orders but **DO NOT** turn the worksheet to school. You will need the worksheet to distribute your goods to the appropriate friends and family.
2. Go to [www.innisbrook.com](http://www.innisbrook.com) and enter your orders online. Select "***Parents EZ***". Our school number is : **118524**
3. Print out your voucher.
4. You can enter as many new orders as you like during the sales dates.
5. Turn in your voucher(s) and your total payment by Monday 9/28 to your classroom. Make sure all checks are made payable to "Palm Crest PTA".
6. Please note that an additional \$0.25 needs to be collected per item as indicated in the order form. Do not collect additional sales tax.

Remember to ask friends and family! They can also order online at [www.innisbrook.com](http://www.innisbrook.com) and the school will receive 50% profit. Internet orders also apply toward an individual student's prize levels but the student seller **MUST** register.

Each student who sells at least ten items and enters their order on ***EZ*** is eligible to download Innisbrook's exclusive Monkey Mayhem Game.

## **COUNSELORS CORNER**

Character Ed/Asset theme for September: SUPPORT  
Character Ed/Asset theme for October: APPRECIATION

As part of our Character Education program and Developmental Asset promotion at Palm Crest, we focused on support this month. Support is one of the important external assets for youth and relates to the need for young people to be surrounded by others who love, care for, appreciate and accept them. Students who have multiple supportive adults in their lives are more likely to be protected against certain risk factors later in life (40 Developmental Assets, Search Institute 2002). It is also part of what we can look at when we think of how we are teaching the positive character traits of caring.

As a school community, we thought of other words or phrases synonymous with support, such as "helping," "reaching out," "being a good friend," or "caring about others." We asked ourselves and our students to reflect on the following: Are there people in your life who have always supported you through hard times? Who are they? How do they support you? Students thought of ways they could reach out to our new students, or others they knew of who might need a little extra right now.

A "Student of the Month" from each class was selected for recognition in demonstrating support. These are PCR students noticed for exceptional behavior in areas such as:

- making special efforts toward a new student
- reaching out or showing interest in others
- inviting others to join an activity
- offering help or showing concern to others

As is tradition, these students are announced at our monthly Spirit Rally and invited to Pizza with the Principal that day.
